### Society Settles into Interim Home

On December 8, 2017 the Society received the keys to 51 Poplar Street in Deep River. The building will be the Society's interim storage facility for the next few years. Nuclear R&D related equipment, artifacts, documents, photos, media clippings, and memorabilia telling Canada's nuclear R&D history will be collected, catalogued, organized, repaired, and prepared for display. The Society is leasing the building from AECL on very favourable terms and staff from CNL are maintaining the building, which constitutes a key contribution in kind to our project.
